

Call for Papers

2009 EAAE PhD Workshop

PhD students are invited to submit a proposal for either an oral or a poster presentation at the 2009 EAAE PhD Workshop which will take place at the

University of Giessen, Germany, September 10-11, 2009

Proposals covering economic research in the areas of agriculture, food, environment and development are welcome. They can be related either to whole research projects or to more specific points of research. Proposals will be in the form of an extended abstract (in English), typically 3-4 pages long and not exceeding 5 pages, including figures and tables (please, use Times New Roman font, point size 12, single spacing). The extended abstract should include the following sections: Introduction, Problem Statement (the research question), Methodology used, Results (or Expected Results), Discussion of Results, Conclusions and a List of (the main) References. The extended abstract will include a front page (does not count against the page limit) which will provide: Title of the paper, name of the author, affiliation, address (including e-mail), and if the submission is for an oral or a poster presentation. Proposals will be evaluated using a double-blind review process.

Deadline for submission of extended abstracts: May 15, 2009.

Authors will be informed of the selection decisions by June 15, 2009. Proposals for oral presentations which cannot be accommodated as such in the program will be considered by the Scientific Committee to be presented as posters or will have to be declined.

Final papers must be submitted by August 15, 2009.

In the case of papers accepted for oral presentations, failure to meet this deadline will imply the paper being dropped from the program.

It is the objective of the EAAE PhD Workshop to give European PhD students from different countries the opportunity to present their ongoing work in a conference setting and to get feedback from their peers and from senior economists. Papers will be reviewed and accepted either as Contributed Papers or as Poster Presentations on the basis of extended abstracts. Participating PhD students will also benefit from plenary sessions in which invited speakers provide guidance on how to successfully carry out economic research in the areas agriculture, food, environment and development.

The 2009 EAAE PhD Workshop will take place at the Main Building of the University of Giessen and will be organised jointly by the Institute of Agricultural Policy and Market Research and the Center for International Development and Environmental Research (ZEU). The 2009 EAAE PhD Workshop is co-sponsored by the European Association of Agricultural Economists (EAAE), the German Association of Agricultural Economists (Gesellschaft für Wirtschafts- und Sozialwissenschaften des Landbaues e.V.), and the Center for International Development and Environmental Re-
